



2020-21 STANDARD PLAYER AGREEMENT

Agreement signed this ___ day of _____, 20___ among the team _____ (hereinafter called the 'club' of the first part, an amateur hockey team and _____ hereinafter called the 'player' of the second part and _____ hereinafter called the 'parent/guardian' of the third part.

WHEREAS the club is a registered Junior 'A' Hockey Club playing in the Central Canada Hockey League and operating out of the city/town of _____ in the province of Ontario as a member of the Canadian Junior Hockey League and Hockey Canada AND WHEREAS the player has exhibited sufficiently exceptional hockey skills to play for the club AND WHEREAS the club wishes to encourage future educational, athletic and training advancement while the player is with the club, AND WHEREAS the club is desirous of the player playing for the club and has provided a Hockey Canada Registration Certificate to sign with the club; AND WHEREAS the CCHL and its' member teams offer a comprehensive development program at the highest amateur level in Canada and as such require player participation to offset a portion of operating costs THE SIGNING OF THIS AGREEMENT AUTHORIZES THE TEAM TO ENTER THE PLAYER IN THE HOCKEY CANADA REGISTRY AS OF JUNE 1 OF THE UPCOMING PLAYING SEASON AND IS BINDING ON BOTH PARTIES

The player covenant and agrees to

- 1-report to training camp in sound and good health, perform at the level required of him to be a member of a Junior A Hockey Club
2-attend all team practices, games, training sessions and team events in a timely manner, in appropriate dress and deportment
3-report to any member team in the CCHL if transferred so long as it does not require him to change schools, and thereby waive any right to appeal based on Hockey Canada Regulation H.11 or H.12
4-attend any classes, fulfill any educational commitments and permit the club to monitor academic attendance and performance
5-refrain from use of alcohol, tobacco and non-prescription drugs while playing for the club
6-use all contracted equipment from the leagues' official supplier for all league and play-off games
7-abide by all league social media, supplemental discipline and any other policies and regulations

The parent/guardian covenant and agrees to

- 1-ensure all of the above player commitments are upheld, supported and endorsed both prior to reporting and while playing for the club
2-allow the club to monitor the attendance and performance of the player during the playing season
3-allow the player to transfer to another member team in the CCHL that does not require a change of school and thereby waive any right to appeal based on Hockey Canada regulation H.11 and H.12

The club covenant and agrees

- 1-to provide the player with the opportunity to play and perform with the club as a full-time member with the benefits provided to all players, save and except a guarantee of playing time in games.
2-to provide the player with all items considered standard benefits itemized in Schedule A
3-to provide a clear and transparent accounting of player fees and refunds as outlined in Schedule B
4-they shall not collect any fees payable to the club, save and except the payment of billeting expenses.

SCHEDULE A – PLAYER BENEFITS

OFF ICE TRAINING MEMBERSHIPS

All players shall receive a training membership during the hockey season. Teams may provide on-site training equipment similar to a training facility if their home facility is so equipped.

BILLETING/TEAM COMMUTING MAXIMUMS

Players living in excess of 80km from their home arena shall not be required to commute to games and practices. These players must be offered a billet in the community where the team plays, either at the teams' expense or up to a maximum of \$500 per month if the player is covering the expense. The team shall be responsible to arrange the billeting in either case.

TEAM TRAVEL MINIMUMS

Teams travelling in excess of 80 km one way for a game are required to provide transportation to the game for any player who lives in the home community, or on the opposite side of the route taken to the game, and along the route to the game. Notwithstanding this policy, teams must be mindful of the distance travelled to the home arena to board the bus. No player shall be required to drive in excess of 80km to participate in a league game. All players travelling in excess of 80 km shall be provided an appropriate post event meal.

PRACTICE TIMES

Teams shall provide at least 3 practices per week in the case of weeks where 3 or fewer league games are scheduled. A minimum of 4.5 hours of weekly ice time shall be provided to all players.

VIDEO ANALYTIC SYSTEM AND PLAYER PROFILES

Players receive video shift clips after each game, the opportunity to utilize the platform to upload videos and maintain their profile and includes athletic and academic information and advanced video capability.

CCHL SHOWCASE EVENTS – NON REFUNDABLE

The CCHL is the original host of league showcases and will be enhancing the event with an expanded schedule this season. Over 200 NHL, NCAA and CHL organizations attend the event each year.

BASELINE CONCUSSION TESTING – HEAD CHECK HEALTH – NON REFUNDABLE

All teams conduct baseline testing prior to the season and provide full rehabilitation from concussion and management of the information allows the player to ensure full recovery in a safe and professional manner.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM – GRADE SLAM TUTORING – NON-REFUNDABLE

Under the direction of the CCHL Academic Advisor, on registration all players are enrolled in 24/7 on-line tutoring access for the entire academic year. Team advisors will prepare the student for profile creation and Grade Slam offers course tutoring, problem solving, pre-grading of papers, SAT preparatory and pre-test preparatory sessions.

CCM EQUIPMENT PROGRAM – NON-REFUNDABLE

Skaters receive six sticks, helmet, visor, gloves and pants with preferred pricing on skates. Goaltenders receive four sticks, custom pads, blocker and catcher and goal pants.
